10 - 21 SEPTEMBER 2025

Our next exhibition is at the Munnings Museum, Dedham. Please note the Selection Day is **Saturday 12 July** at the Willow Centre, Cringleford, Norwich, 8.30 to 9.30am (collect 2.30 to 3.00pm).

You will have received your entry forms. Reminder: please bring BOTH completed forms, A & B, to selection.

Members may submit up to four pieces of work for the selection panel. Those selected artists may then sell up to four unframed original pieces in the browser, and ten cards (at £3 each), you do not need to bring these to selection.

Reminder: all hanging work MUST be framed to exhibition standard, with D rings/strung for hanging, and don't forget to put a label (name, title etc) on the reverse.

Entry fees: £3 per submission and further £9 for selected work.

DAY TRIP: LONDON AND THE RA SUMMER SHOW - Wed 25 June



NNAC members and guests travelled by coach to London recently, to visit the Royal Academy Summer Exhibition (or just enjoy a day out in the city).

I have not visited the RA show before so was keen to see just what everyone is talking about - especially the volume of work hung from floor to ceiling.

My impressions? I am in two minds about this show. One one hand it is a valuable barometer of what is supposed to be the best contemporary art being produced, (if you trust the judgement of the RA curation team), and there was some stunning inspirational work and real talent on display. On the other hand there were times when I simply stood with a question mark over my head wondering if the curators know

something we don't... To my mind there seems to be a return to more figurative art at this show - less pure abstract, maybe the tide of art is changing yet again...

I was also surprised at the amount of simple photography/prints on show and somewhat perplexed by the disproportionate number of RA members with over four pieces - some pretty large. That doesn't seem fair to me when the rest of us struggle to get through the door with just one piece.

Glad I went anyway. As for the prices - I wonder if I can get away with charging £200k for my work...

Paul says about his workshop: "This workshop is intended as a light-hearted activity where you will be introduced to the idea of allowing chance and randomness to inspire creativity. To start the day and get you into gear, we will be doing exercises using ink blots and spontaneous drawing/painting techniques, using water-based ink and drawing materials of your choice. We will round off the day with a more considered work where you will be encouraged to work in a spontaneous manner, again with materials of your choice. Throughout the day I will be discussing how I use this approach in my own practice. Remember: the workshop is not geared to any particular medium, so please bring along whatever you are most comfortable using, plus suitable painting surfaces (watercolour paper, canvas etc) for the afternoon session. This might get messy so please dress accordingly, and have fun and I look forward to seeing you!"

ROYAL NORFOLK SHOW - 25 & 26 JUNE




On two sunny, dusty and hot days in June the Royal Norfolk Show sprang into life again. The Art Gallery, beside the Grand Ring, was showing the best of art work in East Anglia. The Norfolk and Norwich Art Circle has a long and active connection with the Show dating back to the foundation of the Art Gallery just over fifty years ago. This year, approximately twenty five members of the Art Circle were showing paintings and sculptures with some members assisting in the running of the exhibition.

There were over three hundred paintings exhibited and thirty nine sculptures. The entries, from amateur and professional artists, were of a very high standard, from farm animals to land and seascapes that reflected the concepts of the individuals concerned. Some members of the NNAC were demonstrating their skills both around the Show-ground and just outside the Gallery, while others were involved with the organisation of the event. The Norfolk Show was attended by over 80,000 people over two days and it the pinnacle of Art achievement in East Anglia.


Long may the Art Circle be involved in exhibiting and maintaining its connection with the Royal Norfolk Show.


